

About Porch View Dances

'Real People Dancing in Real Spaces'

Porch View Dances (PVD) is an award-winning community dance festival that engages everyday people as creators, storytellers and performers – many of whom have never danced before. Audience members travel from house to house to see new dance works created by professional choreographers and performed by families and friends on porches, front yards, and driveways. PVD was designed to celebrate the stories of neighbourhood residents and to bridge the gap between professional art and everyday people. Our live Tour Guide journeys audiences through the streets bringing dance out of the theatre and into our daily lives.

PVD has taken place in-person across Ontario with events in Ottawa, Kitchener, and with Lakeshore Arts in Long Branch, New Toronto, and Mimico in South Etobicoke. During the pandemic, Porch View Dances went online for two consecutive years and reached people across Canada and internationally. Our 2022 edition of PVD, Porch View Dances: Discovery Walk, is an interactive treasure hunt through Seaton Village that features the beloved PVD traditions of a live Tour Guide, an in-person porch performance, and a Flock Landing, as well as mini dance films and augmented reality experiences. We have prioritized working with performers and collaborators with racialized identities who are underrepresented in the dance community on this project. PVD engages 'real people dancing in real spaces' and in this way sends the strong and powerful message that art is for everyone.

About Kaeja d'Dance

Kaeja d'Dance is driven by a commitment to innovation in the performing arts through the expression of dance and gesture. We explore identity, personal stories and the complexity of the human experience by integrating the interconnected mediums of live performance, dance film, and community engagement. Kaeja provides platforms for and fosters the creation of new Canadian professional dance works which are featured locally and internationally that inspire connections between professional artists and the broader community.

Established in 1990, Kaeja creates award-winning contemporary dance performances for stage, film & communities that have toured the world for 30 years. We design large & small-scale events that integrate community & professional dance artists, site-specific work & audience inclusive arts practices. Kaeja is driven by two distinct artistic forces, Artistic Directors Karen & Allen Kaeja. Kaeja bridges their visions while the space between invites others in to be key collaborators. The Company has created 200+ works, performed, created & taught worldwide: the UK, Europe, China, Japan, USA, Mexico, Scandinavia, India & Israel among others. Alongside creation & performance, Kaeja has been committed to developing & exposing Canadian talent through festival platforms, training & mentorship. Kaeja has received 40+ national & international awards & nominations.

In addition to Kaeja's live performances, touring shows, residencies, commissions, and dance films, Kaeja also works to bring dance into communities through public space animations, community performance projects, inclusive exchanges with everyday people, appearances and dance education workshops. 
Meryem Alaoui (Flock Landing Dancer)

Artistic Director of Jasad Dance Projects, Meryem Alaoui is a dancer-choreographer from Morocco, living in Toronto. Her work is often an invitation towards a softer and sensorial experience of dance. A graduate of the School of Toronto Dance Theatre, she has danced for choreographers Amanda Acorn, Peggy Baker, Angela Blumberg, Julia Male and Antony Hamilton with the company Dancemakers, among others. Her choreographic works, including 'Sand Body' and 'Solo (not solo) Water Study', have been shown in Ontario, Quebec and Morocco. She created a solo for Sonia Rodriguez, principal dancer at the National Ballet of Canada through their CreativAction program. Meryem has received residency support nationally and internationally, and funding from the Canada Council for the Arts, the Ontario Arts Council and the Toronto Arts Council. She also enjoys being involved in community and arts-education projects such as with Arts Etobicoke, Dreamwalker Dance, Kaeja d'Dance and The Arab Community Centre of Toronto.



Allison Cummings (Past PVD Choreographer)

Allison Cummings is a performer/choreographer/art maker, who operates under the umbrella name Sore for Punching You. She is based in Toronto, Canada. Her work has been presented at venues and festivals across Canada since 1996 including The Theatre Centre, Hysteria, Edgy Women/Montreal, Toronto Dance Theatre's 'Four at the Winch', SummerWorks, M:ST Performative Art Festival, 7a -11d, Canada Dance Festival, Fluid Festival, Moving Pictures Festival and Trinity Square Video, Older and Reckless, School of the Toronto DanceTheatre, Theatre Passe Muraille, Porch View Dances, Bright Nights (Citadel et Cie) among many more. Internationally her work has been presented in Accra, Ghana, and Chiang Mai, Northern Thailand. She has self produced her own multidisciplinary full length works, Quiver '02, Clutch '06, Devouring Lions '09, Final Savage Land '13 and Exhale '18 in Toronto.



Mateo Galindo Torres (Flock Landing Dancer)

Mateo Galindo Torres is a multidisciplinary dance artist, actor and performer based in Toronto. He started his training in Bogota at an early age, and deepened his studies in the USA, Cuba, and Canada. As an interpreter, he has worked with a wide array of directors and choreographers, for live theatre, voice over and film. Mateo has performed in Canada, Colombia, Cuba, Germany, Mexico, and Panama. As a choreographer and creator, his work is highly influenced by his Latinx American background, often politically charged, and inspired by social subject matters. Mateo fuses his eclectic movement training within his choreography creating a distinct movement quality. Mateo is the founder and artistic director of GUETCHA GUARITCHA, a dance and performance company whose call is "to find our essential truth, to connect with it, honour it, and to express ourselves from it"



Nickeshia Garrick (In-Person Porch Choreographer)

Nickeshia Garrick is a settler on the stolen land of Tkaronto and has performed on this land for over 25 years. They are unapologetically a Black, Queer Artist, who believes in the healing power of breath through raw emotion and movement and teaches this breathwork at the Toronto Film School. Along with teaching at TFS, Nickeshia is a Certified Personal Trainer and Pilates Instructor and often offers free and discounted sessions to the IBPOC LGBTQ2S+ community in Toronto. Nickeshia holds their BFA in Dance from Simon Fraser University (Vancouver) and is a Dora Mavor Moore, winning and multi-nominated artist.



Jessica Germano (Flock Landing Dancer)

Jessica Germano (she/her) is a contemporary dance artist based in Tkaronto. Jessica completed her BFA in performance dance at The Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson) in 2016. Since graduating, she has worked closely with internationally acclaimed choreographers including Belinda McGuire Dance Projects, Johannes Wieland, and Michel Getman. Jessica was Peggy Baker Dance Project's RBC Emerging Artist Intern (2018/2019), she is a current artist/collaborator with Wild Rabbit Dance (Jane-Alison McKinney), and member of Nostos Dance Collectives (2017-present). In 2020, Jessica joined Valleto Dance Company (NYC/TX) under the direction of Valeria Gonzalez to collaborate and perform in a virtual performance 'MOON' featuring female identifying dance artists from across the globe. Jessica's fascination with movement has led her to teach, and demonstrate for Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson University), Canada's National Ballet School, The National Ballet of Canada's In Studio Ballet, Martha Hicks School of Ballet, and the Toronto District School Board. Jessica continues to harness and develop her craft through various creative explorations, and professional development.




Cassandra Grose (Flock Landing Dancer)

Cassandra is BFA honours graduate from TMU's Performance Dance program and a Toronto based artist. Her creative interests range from visual art, writing practices, dance, and physical expression. During her formal education she performed in works by choreographers such as Benjamin Landsberge, and Alysa Pires. Cassandra has created solo work and collaborated on dance pieces with colleagues. She trained in dance with Tanya Evidente, Kenny Pearl, Vicki St Denys and others. Cassandra has studied acting with Marianne McIssac, and creative processes guided by Kate Hilliard and Louis Laberge-Coté. She has had the privilege of performing in three Fall for Dance North festivals dancing in pieces by Charles Moulton, Anne Plamondon, as well as Bobbi Jene Smith and Or Schraiber. Cassandra has toured Greece with a production by Alyssa Martin and Peggy Baker and participated in a residency at the Centro Coreográfico Maria Pagés with the Metamorphosis Method in Spain.



Allen Kaeja (Co-AD, Past PVD Choreographer)

Allen Kaeja is an internationally recognized and award-winning Choreographer and DanceFilm Director. The child of a refugee and Holocaust survivor, Allen has created 27 years of Holocaust inspired stage and film works. Overall, he's created over 210 stage works and choreographed 35 films. Co-Artistic Director of Kaeja d'Dance with Karen Kaeja, Allen's stage and film works have been featured in commercials, films and festivals around the world. He has received numerous national and international commissions, teaches Kaeja Elevations and Dance Film master classes worldwide. Allen was very excited creating with Director Keira Loughran, choreographing Wendy / Peter Pan until COVID closed Stratford Festival. Karen and Allen received the DanceOntario Lifetime Achievement Award and were Finalists for the TAF-2020 Celebration of Cultural Life Award. Allen and Karen are creating for their upcoming 31st anniversary in the fall of 2022.



Karen Kaeja (Co-AD, PVD Artistic Director, Past PVD Choreographer)

Karen Kaeja (she/her) is a Tkaronto born Ashkenazi. An award-winning performer. choreographer, mentor, community builder and project instigator whose work intersects relational perspectives. "The mastermind behind Porch View Dances" Toronto Star, she develops performance platforms for collaborative relationships between dancers, everyday people and the body. Co-Artistic Director of Kaeja d'Dance with Allen Kaeja, her awards include the 2019 Dance Ontario Lifetime Achievement Award, the CDA "I Love Dance" Community Award and the Paul D. Fleck Fellowship for Innovation. She has been honoured with an American Choreography Award nomination and 7 Dora Mavor Moore nominations, including 4 for Crave (winning outstanding male). Karen is distinguished in The Canadian Who's Who, was a finalist for the 2020 TAF Celebration of Cultural Life Award and the 2017 TAF Muriel Sherrin Award for International achievement, the CDA Innovation Award, NOW's Best Local Choreographer and twice nominated for NOW's Best Dance Company. Commissioned and presented by performance series around the world, she has created over 70 dance works, continues to mentor, dramaturg and perform for many of Canada's brilliant emerging and established choreographers and was Stratford Festival's first movement dramaturg for Wendy and Peter Pan. Karen was the first resident dance artist for both MUN/Dance NL and the Guelph Dance Festival.



Lilia Leon (Flock Landing Dancer)

Lilia Leon is a Mexican-Canadian performing artist with a multi-faceted career including performance, choreography and education in dance and theatre. She graduated from York University with a BA in Dance and is an alumni of the School of Toronto Dance Theatre. Lilia has a long relationship with Kaeja d'Dance and has been involved with PVD through performing, teaching, and coordination for several years. Looking for balance and sustainability in her artistic practice she became a Registered Massage Therapist in 2021. She continues to create, perform and produce her own work and is passionate about supporting fellow creatives through massage therapy and movement coaching. 
Pulga Muchochoma (Past PVD Choreographer)

Pulga Muchochoma was born in Quelimane, Mozambique. His dance career and training began in Quelimane with Montes Namuli Dance Company. In August of 2006, he came to Toronto with the company for the International AIDS Conference. With Montes Namuli/Shakespeare Link Canada, he performed in several shows in venues in Toronto and Mozambique. When Montes Namuli returned to Mozambique, Muchochoma stayed in Toronto to study at The School of Toronto Dance Theatre. He has worked with Toronto Dance Theatre under Artistic Director Christopher House from 2009 till 2020. During his time with TDT he has had the pleasure of working and collaborating with many local and international choreographers as member of TDT and outside of the company. Also with TDT, Muchochoma participated in the 2015 Opening ceremony of the Toronto Pan Am Games with Cirque du Soleil and NBS. He is also the creator and founder of African Dance and Fitness with Pulga since 2015.









Andrea Nann (Past PVD Choreographer)

Andrea Nann is a contemporary dance artist and founding artistic director of Dreamwalker Dance Company. She creates work for the stage, film and outdoor sites. A graduate of York University's Department of Fine Arts, Andrea was a member of the Danny Grossman Dance Company for 15 years from 1988-2003 where she created, performed and taught major roles from the works of Mr. Grossman and guest choreographers. Over a 31-year career in contemporary and modern dance, she has contributed to the creation of new works by over 60 dance/theatre creators. From 2004-2015 Andrea created/produced 9 editions of multi-arts program The Whole Shebang and from 2012-2016 she devised/produced a 4-year/4-city multi-arts collaborative project; The Ontario Shebang. In 2018 she created The Welcome Project, addressing inclusion and cultural literacy based on internal and external challenges faced by Newcomers to Canada. In 2016 Ontario Contact recognized Andrea as Artist of the Year for contributions to the Performing Arts touring sector in Ontario and in 2019 she received a Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding Performance by an Individual in Dance.

Kathleen Rea (Past PVD Choreographer)

Kathleen Rea danced with Canada's Ballet Jorgen, National Ballet of Canada & Tiroler Landestheater (Austria). Kathleen teaches Modern Dance at George Brown Dance and Centennial College Acting Program. She has choreographed over 40 dance works and been nominated for five DORA awards. Kathleen is also a corecipient of a K. M. Hunter Choreographic Award. Kathleen is a published author ("The Healing Dance", Charles C. Thomas). She has a Master's in Expressive Arts. In January 2015 Kathleen became a candidate teacher of the Axis Syllabus. She is the director of REAson d'etre dance productions who produces both the Wednesday Dance Jam and the Contact Dance International Film Festival. Kathleen has Autism and works to educate the world about neurodiversity.

Jake Runeckles (Tour Guide)

Jake is a theatremaker, musician and producer based in Toronto. A studious kid, Jake began training in classical piano at 4 years old, and as a teenager, outside of a devotion to maths, sciences, and programming, Jake developed a love for musicals. Since training as an actor at George Brown Theatre School and the Birmingham Conservatory for Classical Theatre, Jake has worked as an actor, musician, playwright, and producer for companies such as The Stratford Festival, Cahoots Theatre, Young People's Theatre, Clay and Paper Theatre, and Theatre by the Bay. Selected acting credits include The Neverending Story, Henry VIII (Stratford Festival); I and You (Outlook Theatre); The Secret Garden (Young People's Theatre).

Mio Sakamoto (Flock Landing Dancer)

Mio Sakamoto is a Toronto based performer, choreographer, and dance educator originally from Japan. She has performed (selected) Crépuscule by Marie-Josée Chartier, October Sky by Paul-André Fortier, XTOD - SOLO DANCE XCHANGE for Xtraordinary Japan Tour by Kaeja d'Dance, and Mani.Deux by Northfoot Movement for its premier at Fall for Dance North in 2019. Sakamoto's choreographic work (selected), Submerge, reverie (dance film), Where Do We Go? (dance film), Systematic, Oblivious or Naive, and Cater To You, were presented in Canada and Japan. She has recently choreographed for a new 30 min film project, Know Not What by Bow Echo Collective. She was Kaeja Elevation Choreography Assistant for the Wendy & Peter Pan production of the Stratford Festival in 2019/2020. In 2020, she received the RBC Newcomer Arts Award by Neighbourhood Arts Network (Toronto Arts Foundation). In 2021, she was selected for the first year-long Artist in Residence of Kaeja d'Dance.



Lua Shayenne (Past PVD Choreographer)

Lua Shavenne weaves stories, through dance, song and word. Her art practice is embedded in her African roots and her Faith. Her goal is to "effect a spiritual conquest" by establishing a relation with the human hearts and create original, inspiring and relevant art. A 2016/17/18 K.M. Hunter Dance award nominee and a recipient of the 2013 BMO seeds Fund Award for Artists working in community, Lua is the creator and interpreter of the dance theatre children series titled. Tales and Dances Around the Baobab of which Yassama and The Beaded Calabash, is the fourth tale. Lua is the artistic director of Dora nominated, Lua Shayenne Dance Company (LSDC). LSDC blends dance, music and storytelling rooted in West African culture with contemporary art forms and social commentary. Lua is currently creating WAVES VAGUES and FRONTIERS FRONTIÈRES for LSDC. Through LSDC, Lua has also launched YENSA Festival - a biennal festival that celebrates women in dance. Performing highlights include HOLOSCENES tours in the US, UK, Abu Dhabi & Australia, Été au Théâtre in Italy, Fall for Dance North, Luminato, Dusk Dances, d:mic and more. Lua teaches at Toronto Metropolitan University's dance program and brings African dance, music, storytelling and culture to grassroots organizations and schools all over Canada and Europe.



Irma Villafuerte (In-Person Porch Choreographer, Flock Landing Dancer)

Irma Villafuerte is a Central American dance artist and educator based in Tkaronto. She is a first-generation daughter of refugees from Nahuat-Pipil Territory Kuskatan (Place of Jeweled necklaces), post-colonial El Salvador. She is a graduate of George Brown Dance: Her experience and training extend to Latin American and Caribbean dances, and Cuban Contemporary technique. She is a 2021 Toronto Arts Foundation Emerging Artist Finalist. Since 2017, she has embarked in a choreographic development through residencies with TDT Emerging Voices, Aluna Theatre, Dance Makers Peer Learning Network and George Brown Dance. Her artistic mission is embodying cultural, social-political and migrant narratives of marginalized and racialized communities. As a daughter of refugee parents, her passion for social justice, human rights, and political art making, is the driving force for creation in Irma's choreographic and performance work, leading her to incubate her solo on her historic memory "nudoDESnudo". She recently on the faculty at Casa Maiz' Semillas Latinas summer camp for Latin American children since 2013 as a dance instructor and choreographer; as of late, she is also a new member of the faculty of the Theatre Department at Randolph College for the Performing Arts as a Voice, Text and Movement educator. She's had the honor to perform, train and create in various arts festivals and workshops across the Americas and overseas, such as Night Shift 2020 Presented by the Citadel & Compaigne, Fall for Dance North's Open Studio, The Rhubarb Festival, DanceWeekend Ontario, Aluna Theatre's Panamerican Routes Festival, RUTAS and Caminos Festival, Panamania 2015, La 12 Bienal de la Habana 2015 for (IN)DISCIPLINAS, Vanguardia Dance Projects Festival, Danza Corpus Annual Open Space Temporada in Matanzas, Cuba, International Dance Meeting by Danza Libre in Guantanamo, CounterPulse Performing Diaspora in San Francisco. She has been part of choreographic works by Santee Smith (Kahawi Dance Theatre), Alejandro Ronceria, Roshanak Jaberi (Jaberi Dance Theatre), Victoria Mata, Kaeja D'dance, Aria Evans (Political Movement), Ryan Lee, Derek Sangster, Tina Fushell, Arsenio Andrade, Sharon B. Moore, Jose Angel Carret (Danza Corpus), Esteban Aguilar (Danza Fragmentada, Cuba).


